In at least one conclusion, try to incorporate elements of your hook, which will strengthen your message as a whole. Some ideas for hooking your audience include (but are not limited to):

Describe a "what if" scenario	Use the word "imagine"
Tell a personal story	Describe something surprising about your work
Explain what excites you about your work	Use a metaphor
Ask the audience rhetorical questions	Connect to a common experience
